



FIRST RECORDED HUMAN USE – EUROPE

MAY 2013

The first human use with the iTClamp™ 50 in Europe was in Copenhagen, Denmark in May 2013. An elderly female patient suffered a knife stab wound to the head. A physician applied the iTClamp50 at the scene to control hemorrhage from the wound. The physician was extremely satisfied with the performance of the device (rated the device 10/10). The patient did briefly experience moderate pain (4 out of 10, as observed by the physician) during application; however, once in place the patient experienced less pain (2 out of 10, as observed by the physician). The physician observed very minimal pain upon removal of the device (1 out of 10). There were no reported issues associated with application or removal of the device.

LESSONS LEARNED:

- 1 Successfully addressed a scalp wound in an elderly patient.
- 2 Minimal pain observed upon application, after application and upon removal of the device.
- 3 No issues associated with application or removal of the device in an elderly patient.

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
